Sunday, February 11, 2018

Prayer of Worship and Adoration

Prayer for Surrender

³ *Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves.* ⁴ *Let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others.* ⁵ *Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus. Philippians 2:3-5 (ESV)*

Tuesday, February 13, 2018

Prayer of Confession

*Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. **Ephesians 4:31 (NIV)***

Father, in light of Your Word, I offer this prayer of confession. Do I have a problem with anger sometimes or with resentment or holding grudges? Forgive me when I am quick to get upset. Search my heart . . .

Pause to let the Holy Spirit search your heart; silently confess anything He brings to mind, and ask for the strength to turn away from sin . . .

Wednesday, February 14, 2018

Prayer for Persecuted Christians

*And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the saints. **Ephesians 6:18 (NIV)***

Sudan – The persecution in Sudan mainly stems from the government and radical Islam, systematic in nature and reminiscent of ethnic cleansing. Under the authoritarian rule of President al-Bashir and his party, there is no rule of law in the country. Press and media laws are highly restrictive, while freedom of expression has been curtailed drastically. The government strives to maintain a policy favoring one religion, one culture and one language. Because

Islam is so deeply embedded in Sudanese society, many Christians have chosen to move to South Sudan since the declaration of its independence in 2011.

This is an incredibly difficult time for Christians in Sudan. They are losing churches they have gathered and worshipped in for years. The government regularly arrests and intimidates Christian leaders and has demanded on at least one occasion that leadership be handed over to a government-supported committee. When interacting with Sudanese Muslims, Christians must be extremely cautious, as any mention of their faith can be construed as an “act that encourages apostasy against Islam.” Some Christians are arrested on charges of espionage, and many churches have been demolished, with others on an official list awaiting demolition. In areas with ongoing conflict, Christians are attacked indiscriminately.

Pray using the following Prayer Points:

- Pray for Christians in Sudan who face intense oppression and persecution. Pray for protection and opportunities to fellowship with other believers. Pray also for church leaders to stand strong amidst pressure that Islamic extremists place on their churches.
- Pray that the Sudanese government, one of the most dictatorial regimes in Africa, will become more accepting of Christianity and allow freedom of religion. Pray for the Lord’s work in the hearts of the Sudanese leaders, and that the Holy Spirit would convict them to bring justice and peace to the country.

Thursday, February 15, 2018

Prayer for Unbelievers

¹³ For “Everyone who calls on the name of the LORD will be saved.” ¹⁴ But how can they call on him to save them unless they believe in him? And how can they believe in him if they have never heard about him? And how can they hear about him unless someone tells them? **Romans 10:13-14 (NLT)**

Father, I pray for (*name someone you know that has not accepted Jesus Christ as their personal Savior*). You are a merciful God and You have great love for those who don't know You in the pardon of their sins. You said in Your Word that, everyone who calls on Your name will be saved. I pray Lord that You would speak to (*name*) that they would call out to You for salvation. I pray Lord that You would use their circumstances and stir in them the real need of knowing You. Use me, as Your vessel, to share with them the good news about Jesus Christ, through a testimony from my life, of how great You are. Lord, I want them to have a relationship with You and experience the abundant life that Christ can provide them.

Friday, February 16, 2018

Prayer of Thanksgiving/Praise

¹ The LORD is my shepherd; I have all that I need. ² He lets me rest in green meadows; he leads me beside peaceful streams. ³ He renews my strength. He guides me along right paths, bringing honor to his name. ⁴ Even when I walk through the darkest valley, I will not be afraid, for you are close beside me. Your rod and your staff protect and comfort me. ⁵ You prepare a feast for me in the presence of my enemies. You honor me by anointing my head with oil. My cup overflows with blessings. ⁶ Surely your goodness and unfailing love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will live in the house of the LORD forever. **Psalm 23:1-6 (NLT)**

For a few moments, think back over the last week and see how the Lord has blessed you in the following areas, based on the truths of Psalm 23. How He has provided for your spiritual needs?
